1 John 3:13-18

13 Do not be surprised, brothers, [a] if the world hates you. 14 We know that we have crossed over from death to life, because we love our brothers. The one who does not love[b] remains in death. 15 Everyone who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life remaining in him. 16 This is how we have come to know love: Jesus[c] laid down his life for us. And we also should lay down our lives for our brothers. 17 Whoever has worldly wealth and sees his brother in need but closes his heart against him—how can God's love remain in him? 18 Dear children, let us love not only with word or with our tongue, but also in action and truth.

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THE QUESTION(S) OF THE DAY:
