A Father's Love

Jesus said, "The son got up and went to his father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion for him; he ran to his son, threw his arms around him and kissed him" (Luke 15:20).

He was homeless, smelly, and almost starving to death. But the worst thing was that he knew it was all his fault. He thought his father was cruel and overbearing; there were too many rules. He wanted freedom. He wanted to have fun, but his father was all about responsibility and hard work. So, he asked for his share of the inheritance. He didn't care about the farm; he just wanted the money. As soon as he got it, he left. He could finally do what he wanted to do. But it didn't take long, and all that money was gone—partying is expensive. Those he thought were his friends left as soon as he ran out of money. He was all alone and miserable. He had two choices, and neither seemed pleasant. He could continue as he was and hope he could scrape enough together each day so that he wouldn't starve to death, or he could go back home.

He headed for home. He was prepared to grovel, to ask to be just a hired hand on his father's farm. But he didn't get the opportunity to do much groveling. As soon as his father saw him coming, he ran out to meet him. He hugged and kissed him and gave orders for a huge celebration in his honor. The rebellious son had expected a cool reception. He had expected an "I told you so." Instead he got what he knew he didn't deserve: a joyous welcome home.

You and I are that young man who rebelled against his father. We have all rebelled against our heavenly Father. We have considered him to be cruel and overbearing and having too many rules—someone who doesn't want us to have any fun. We have all separated ourselves from him and broken his commandments. Our consciences tell us that he is angry, that we deserve whatever pain or suffering comes our way. Could our heavenly Father still love us? Could he still welcome us to his eternal home in heaven?

Jesus' story about the disobedient son in Luke 15:11-24 is a short story that speaks volumes for our lives. It assures us of God's love and our heavenly home. Our heavenly Father loves us so much that he punished his obedient Son, Jesus, in our place so that he can welcome us as his dear children and heirs of eternal life. Instead of giving us what we deserve for our rebelliousness, he gives us what we don't deserve: complete forgiveness in Jesus.





Gemeinde Geschichte (Congregation History)

They Never Had a Pastor of their Own – and in 1880 They Insisted On It

In 2024 Emmanuel Mecan will be 158 years old. You can add a dozen more years to that before they organized into a congregation in 1866. During that time, they were served by 15 pastors. Here's the thing though. They never had a pastor all their own. They always shared.

In the beginning, the German speaking immigrants didn't have a pastor at all. They tried the preachers of the German Methodists who were active in the area. But that wouldn't do. Except for speaking German, it was not the same at all. Then for the next dozen years the Lutherans that were scattered around the county shared a pastor, first from the Missouri Synod, then the Wisconsin Synod, and then the Missouri Synod again. It's a long and complex story, so let's just leave it at that for now.

In 1869 things changed. On Sunday, August 15th, Pastor John Hoyer of the Wisconsin Synod, led worship and preached at both Emmanuel Mecan and St. John's Princeton. Both congregations were in a pastoral vacancy. That day both congregations called Pastor Hoyer to be their pastor. He accepted both calls, and the dual parish of Mecan/Princeton was born.

So it remained until 1880. The parish was growing and with it the workload. St. Stephens of Dayton became Pastor Hoyer's charge in 1874. A daughter congregation of Mecan was organized in Montello in 1878. The plan in the summer of 1880 was to have Seminary graduate Adolph Hoyer (son of Pastor John) ordained and called to assist his father. Part of the plan apparently was to have the Mecan/Montello group call a pastor of its own. In so many words, the answer was, "Nothing doing,"

In a July 5, 1880 letter to Wisconsin Synod president, John Bading, the younger Hoyer (Adolph) wrote, In spite of all our desire, we could not succeed in getting a call drawn up for a pastor just for Mecan and its ancillary in Montello. Princeton views Mecan as its main ancillary congregation and will never be the one to initiate a separation. Mecan, on the other hand, continues to want absolutely nothing to do with a preacher of its own and will also presumably remain in that attitude as long as it is not completely debt free.

Two months later it was the senior Hoyer (John) writing to President Bading with a slightly different strategy. He reported on the fact of the ordination and installation of son Adolph. He added,

The congregation in Mecan categorically refuses to call their own preacher right now. If I had refused to serve the people there any longer as an ancillary congregation, then they would have turned either to the Missouri or the Iowan pastor who are in the neighborhood. (That's a whole other story.) The only way to keep from losing the congregations was to have my son called as assistant pastor. The responsibility lies on the congregation in Mecan.



When John Hoyer (left) retired in 1884, son Adolph (right) succeeded him in Princeton and Dayton. Pastor Christian Sauer accepted the call to serve the Mecan/Montello combo. That arrangement continues to this day.

It may have been out of necessity during the early formative years, and then apprehension later on about going it alone. Before too long, sharing a pastor became all anyone ever knew. The fact is, in all its long and storied history, Mecan never had a pastor all its own. In fact, in 1880 anyway, they insisted on it.

News from SUNDAY SCHOOL








