The Measure of a Mustard Seed

Jesus told them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed, which a man took and planted in his field. Though it is the smallest of all your seeds, yet when it grows, it is the largest of garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and perch in its branches" (Matthew 13:31,32).

Who is America's richest man? America's tallest mountain? Largest lake? Largest city? Most populous state? If you answered Elon Musk, Denali (Mount McKinley), Lake Superior, New York City, and California, you are part of the proof that Americans pay attention to big things. We live in bigger houses, eat larger meals, and work longer hours than almost any other people in the world. We tend to live by the maxim, "Bigger is better."

But Jesus takes the "less is more" approach. He says: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed." Have you ever seen a mustard seed? It's so small that you could hold thousands in your hand. Why would Jesus tell us this? Because it's possible to be so focused on what *looks* big and impressive that we overlook him and his blessings.

It's a common mistake. At first glance, there was nothing big or impressive about Jesus. When he came to establish his kingdom, he arrived as a child of a poor girl in a conquered country. He was born in a barn. He grew up in an obscure village. His followers were nobodies. He never wrote a book or held a high position. He never lived in a palace or even a house of his own. After a few years in the public eye, he was killed on a cross like a common slave. On Good Friday, he *looked* small and powerless.

When Jesus spoke about the mustard seed, he gave us a short story that speaks volumes for our lives. The measure of a mustard seed is not its tiny size but the huge plant that it grows into. In the same way, the measure of Jesus' humble life and death is not how many people missed its meaning at the time but what he accomplished. By his perfect life and his innocent death, Jesus has freed the world from the guilt of sin. Countless millions who have put their trust in him have become part of his eternal kingdom.

When Jesus rose from his humble grave to conquer death on Easter morning, he proved that what seems small and weak can be amazingly powerful. It's Easter time again—why not celebrate by exploring what his life and death and resurrection can mean in your life? You might be surprised!

Gemeinde Geschichte (Congregation History)

Joe

The roster of principals of St. John's School lists fourteen men. Third on that list is F. W. Mattek. Mr. Mattek served from 1948 to 1959. Anyone who was ever on a first-name basis with Floyd William Mattek knew him simply as "Joe."

This Mattek family hailed from Two Creeks, WI. Joe was born and raised on the family farm along with two brothers. After elementary school, he attended Northwestern Prep in Watertown. Then came the trek west and enrollment at the teacher training school of the synod, Dr. Martin Luther College in New Ulm, MN.

Joe graduated from DMLC in the spring of 1941and 21 years of teaching ministry began in Kewaunee, WI. Before the summer of '41 ended he married another DMLC student, Marcella Ehlert. The marriage that began in the south-central town of Eitzen, MN was to last 72 years and brought 10 children into this world. After a teaching stop in Newburg, WI, the sizeable Mattek clan filled the teacherage in Montello, called St. John's home, and blessed our congregations.



These post-WWII years were the beginning of the Baby Boomer era. Steady growth was the norm and change to meet that growth was the order of the day. The 75th anniversary booklet of St. John's describes the local situation. "Because of a decided increase in the enrollment," the congregation in 1949 was convinced of the need for a second teacher. Curriculum and student assessment were updated. In 1951 an addition was built, and the school was modernized and remodeled. City sewer and water were installed. It was good-bye to the outdoor toilets. In 1956 a classroom had to be added in the basement, and a fund for a new school was started.

In 1959 Principal Joe Mattek was led to follow a new call. He moved his considerable gifts, his kind and pleasant demeaner, and his trademark bow tie to Menasha. He was a respected leader in the church at large. It was while he was in Menasha that <u>Teacher</u> Mattek decided to train to become <u>Pastor</u> Mattek. Local pastors under the supervision of the Mequon Seminary provided the pastoral training. In 1964 he was called to Emmanuel, Koberg, WI and ordained into the pastoral ministry. For nearly four decades he pastored congregations, in Koberg, in Riga and Ann Arbor, MI. In semi-retirement from 1986-1993 he served in Fredericksburg, Texas.

After a full and faithful life and ministry of 95 years, the Lord of the Church said that was more than enough and called Teacher/Principal/Pastor Joe home to heaven in 2013. We were blessed to enjoy and reap the benefits of a small part of that life here in Montello and Mecan.
