Build on Solid Rock

Jesus said, "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock" (Matthew 7:24,25).

If you had to evacuate your home because of rising water following severe storms, imagine how difficult it would be to return and assess the damage: muddy floors, moldy walls, and worldly possessions headed for a dumpster. It would be emotionally devastating to observe the physical destruction that the waters caused.

Jesus told a story about building on a location to avoid destruction. He compared a wise builder and a foolish one. The foolish builder built his house on a nice sandy stretch by the water. It was a beautiful place to live until the storm hit. There was no defense against the rising waters—a complete loss (maybe even a loss of life!). In contrast, there was a wise builder. He built his house in the hills; he spent the extra time and money to firmly position it on solid rock. It was worth it. The building remained high above the floodwaters and stood strong against the wind.

Jesus' short story speaks volumes for our lives. He wants us to think carefully about the foundation on which we build our lives. It needs to be strong when life's storms strike. When the company is downsized, we want the strength to keep a positive outlook. When conflict loosens family ties, we want tight knots to hold it

together. When we've really messed up, the guilt must not sweep us away. When bad news comes, there needs to be rock-like endurance to get us through.

There's much advice today about successfully building our lives: build up a network of reliable family and friends, develop more of a positive attitude, get different forms of insurance for rainy days, and pursue proven avenues of achievement. But in the end, they're all "sand foundations." The storms that overwhelm human hearts and hopes are far too violent. We need something stronger to build on.

Jesus tells us to build our lives and futures on the solid rock of his word. It takes some time and effort to build that way, but Jesus says it's worth it. Hearing of his sacrifice on the cross brings us the lasting peace that we're forgiven. Hearing that Jesus rose and ascended to rule over all things gives us firm hope in the midst of life's uncertainties.

Don't build your life on shifting sand. Build on solid rock. That's Jesus. His teachings give you the strongest foundation for life. Confidently build your life on him. We'd be glad to help you do exactly that!

We'd love to speak to you about this more fully so that all are prepared and speak with one voice as we proclaim Christ to the world. 

Gemeinde Geschichte (Congregation History)

Christoph Tagatz - Lay Leader

Johannes Strieter was one of the pioneer pastors who led the Lutheran immigrants of Marquette and Green Lake counties. He arrived in December of 1859 and served until spring of 1865. Pastor Strieter described his family's arrival here in his autobiography. Traveling from Milwaukee via train they arrived in Ripon. From there they endured a less comfortable wagon ride to Princeton. Due to a hitch in communication, they arrived unexpected and unannounced. It just so happened that one of the members of the congregation was in town. He invited the pastor and his family to settle in at their farm for the night, which was about 15 miles further to the northwest. That congregation member was Christoph Tagatz.

Christoph Tagatz was a 23-year-old, newly married, farmer from Crystal Lake Township near Budsin. He worked a farm on a narrow trail known today as Eagle Road, just a short distance east of today's Hwy 22. Across the path was the farm of his parents who immediately came over to help serve as the welcoming committee. Christoph and his new bride provided a meal and beds of straw for the Strieter family for their first night in their new parish. Christoph Tagatz would continue to be one of the lay leaders of the developing congregation, and the worship that was held in a nearby community building was even referred to as the Tagatz church, (near the present day Matz-Tagatz Cemetery on Eagle Road). On occasion he would lead worship in the absence of a pastor. He would be one of the founding members of St John's Lutheran Church of Budsin.

Jump ahead about twenty years to 1878. Ten miles south of the Tagatz farm, the daughter congregation of Emmanuel, Big Mecan, was being organized in Montello and would later be incorporated as St. John's Lutheran Church. By this time Tagatz had been elected treasurer of Marquette County and moved to Montello. It is not at all surprising that one of the first elected trustees of the new congregation was – you guessed it - Christoph Tagatz. The Budsin church records show that his name had been crossed out on the roster of voting members. Instead, his signature was recorded in the organization documents of the new Montello church. What remained the same, however, was the strong and respected leadership for building up and furthering God's Church. In his obituary it was said that Christoph Tagatz "enjoyed the esteem and confidence of his fellow citizens, and they regarded him as an able and capable man." He remained faithful until death and received the

crown of life in April of 1916.

One characteristic of a healthy and vibrant congregation has always been to have solid, sanctified, and evangelical leaders. By anyone's measure, Christoph Tagatz qualified, and he showed it throughout his adult life. God used him and his gifts to help lay the foundation of two congregations, both called St. John's.

May God always bless us with such godly men and willing, able leaders.
