# Search For What Was Lost

Jesus told this parable, "Suppose a woman has ten silver coins and loses one. Doesn't she light a lamp, sweep the house and search carefully until she finds it? And when she finds it, she calls her friends and neighbors together and says, 'Rejoice with me; I have found my lost coin.' In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents" (Luke 15:8-10).

My wife works with a lady who buys her lottery tickets every now and then. One day, a rumor spread that our local grocery store sold a \$100,000 ticket. We both thought, "Are we winners?" How would we spend it? Then I said, "Honey, where's the ticket?" After a brief panic and a 20-minute search of the house, we found it. The ticket was a loser.

When we lose something that we hold to be valuable, we search for it frantically. That's what Jesus described in this short story about a woman searching for a coin that she lost. Without Jesus, you and I are like that lost coin. Our lustful thoughts, hurting words, and loveless deeds—everything we think, say, or do that fails to be perfect—are sins that separate us from God. How frightening to be lost in sin!

Thankfully, though, there is good news! Jesus came "to seek and to save what was lost" (Luke 19:10). God sent Jesus to find us and reconnect us to God. Jesus did that

by loving us so much that he paid for all our sins by his death on the cross. That's how much Jesus loves us!

Jesus searches for us and finds us. The angels in heaven rejoice! Jesus comes to us through his Word and takes away our fear by comforting us with the forgiveness of sins. He assures us that he has made us dearly loved children of God. Through Jesus, heaven is our inheritance.

God loves us so much that he stopped at nothing to find us and save us from eternal separation from him in hell. Through Jesus, we have the gift of eternal life, which is a whole lot more valuable than winning the lottery. How fortunate we are! We will never be lost again when we cling in faith to Jesus, our Savior.

Come and share with us the love of Jesus. Like heaven's angels, we can rejoice over all that Jesus did to find us and give us life with God.

(1Cor. 10:17) Members of other denominations have, by joining those church bodies, publicly declared their allegiance to the teaching of those churches. By also communing here at this altar it would send a confusing message regarding not only what the believe, but also what the Bible teaches and what this church and its members believe and confess. We'd love to speak to you about this more fully so that all are prepared and speak with one voice as we proclaim Christ to the world. # Gemeinde Geschichte (Congregation History)

#### Mr. Radichel

There are still a few folks today who can remember Mr. Radichel. He arrived in Montello in 1959 and served as the 4<sup>th</sup> principal of St. John's Lutheran School, following Misters Fuerstenau, Meyer, and Mattek in that role. His service lasted only five years until 1964 but is remembered fondly. One lower grade student said of him that "he was nice and not scary at all." Mr. Radichel was an important bridge, so to speak, between life in the old school building and the "new school" still in use today.

Dennis Jerome Radichel was a Wisconsin boy through and through. He was born in New London in December of 1939, attended Bethlehem Lutheran School in Hortonville, and was a 1956 graduate of Winnebago Lutheran Academy. He earned a teaching degree at Bethany Lutheran College in Mankato, MN. This school of our sister synod, the Evangelical Lutheran Synod, was a two-year college in those days. Upon completion of his studies, it didn't take very long before he was called to be our principal in Montello.

Not only was Mr. Radichel a busy principal at St. John's, but he also found time to find a wife and life-long companion.




Marion Bobholz was a Randolph gal and the two were married in 1971 at Trinity in Friesland. They raised two girls, Kay and Kim. The friendly and affable Marion became an active and visible presence in congregational and school life. It was said that early in their marriage Dennis and Marion enjoyed bike, snowmobile, and motorcycle rides together. The Radichels also shared an avid interest in following the Packers, Brewers, and Badgers.

In 1964 Mr. Radichel took a call to Grace Lutheran school in Oshkosh. Throughout his teaching ministry he enjoyed coaching basketball and leading choral groups. After nearly a decade in Oshkosh, came a move to Onalaska where Dennis took up ownership of his father's business, Ed's Upholstery Shop, which he ran for 40 years until his retirement in 2017. Christian education remained close to his heart, however. He was the chairman of the Board of Education for many years at St. Paul's, Onalaska was actively involved in the ministry of Luther High School. Marion became the administrative assistant there as well and was a friendly greeter to all who entered the school doors.

At the age of 81, the earthly pilgrimage of Dennis Radicel came to an end. He died at home May 21, 2020. It was said the "He fell asleep confident that eternal life in heaven awaited him because of

his gracious Lord's salvation. Above all, Dennis was a man of



faith who put his trust in the Lord for forgiveness and eternal life. His faith has now become sight. Truly, it is well with his soul." His beloved wife of 58 years soon followed him in November of 2021. The Onalaska City Cemetery holds their earthly remains as they await the coming of their Savior on the last day.

# UPDATE #2 on Co-Hosting 2026 Convention Beaver Dam Circuit Fall Rally, October 12, 2024

**Kick-off Meeting for Convention Planning** was held Saturday, June 1, 2024. Those attending from the 3 Circuits reviewed deadlines, a responsibility overview, and the makeup and duties of the 7 convention committees. 7 attended from Beaver Dam Circuit (Joanne Gregor-Ripon, Barb Zondag-Randolph, Linda Wachholz-Montello, Sandy Beimborn-Portage, Rachel Wolff-Princeton, Linda Pollesch-Markesan, Sue Pagel-Beaver Dam).

Invitational Letter was drafted, and the International Board accepted.

Venue: (Still unofficial—no contract signed, but \$\$ paid down) Monona Terrace-Madison Theme: International Board chose "Cast Out Your Nets" Matthew 4:18-19 (NIV).

- 4) Hosting Circuits -- a) Convention Co-Chairs b) Committee Chairs
- c) Convention Treasurer d) Convention Volunteers.

Committee Chairs, Members, & Volunteers Many, many committee workers and volunteers will be needed before and during the 2026 Convention. Many, but not all, of the committee members and convention volunteers must register and attend the 2026 Convention. Remember that Beaver Dam Circuit offers financial help under the Send One Sister program to those attending their first convention. Perhaps 2026 will present them this opportunity and also the privilege of helping with the convention!

Responsibilities Overview: Chain of command: 1) Board of Directors 2) Convention Planner 3) Central Office

#### Convention Committees

1) Courtesy Committee prepares helpful info about convention site/area and serves as hostesses.

"Requires: Chair

Plus 6-10 committee members

Plus 30-50 volunteers

**Duties:** business meeting tellers, courtesy table women, introducers, greeters, meal door monitors, general session room seaters & monitors, meal guides, nurses, seating assistants, workshop monitors, banquet table ticket coordinator.

2) Decorations is responsible for bringing the convention theme to life through decorations.

Requires: Chair Sub Committee: Theme Banner

Plus 2 committee members Plus volunteers (number varies)

Areas for decorations: fover, general session stage, meal tables, photo opportunity sites

3) Displays Committee is responsible for the display room at convention, ensuring all displays relate to and agree with our LWMS mission statement; signs up each congregation to prepare a

display topic. Requires: Chair

Plus 1 committee member

Plus 2-3 volunteers

Display room consists of 2 types of displays: mission displays prepared by local congregations and those from other organization that make application through Central Office. If mission groups are permitted to sell items from their mission field, a separate mission sales room will be established.

4) Publicity Committee publicizes the convention within the WELS and to local community, submits invitational bulletin insert and poster. Required: Chair

Plus 1 committee member

5) Registration receives and assembles all registration materials and distributes tote bags at the

convention. Requires: Chair

Plus 2 committee members Plus 20-40 volunteers

6) Worship works with the LWMS board pastors to select and coordinate readings and hymns for the devotions and opening/closing worship services. Requires: Chair

> Plus 3 committee members Plus 20 volunteers

#### Convention Attendance

- ✓ 'All **committee chairs & committee members** must register for the convention.
- ✓ All **convention volunteers** are strongly encouraged to register for the convention.
- ✓ Any convention volunteer working in the general session or workshop rooms on Friday and Saturday must be registered for the Convention.

#### What First? What Next?

First, **PRAY** for this convention and the volunteers working on it. THINK about and **PRAY** for people to fill these positions. These are available to ALL WOMEN of our circuit congregations – not just those present today or who are part of your ladies' groups. *Get Linda Wachholz names of people from BD to contact but it would be* **best for you talk to them first.** Older middle schoolers and teenagers would be great for helping with some of the volunteer positions. Team them up with someone with a willing heart but maybe not as able a body!

#### DEADLINES!!

24 to 30 months before the convention (June 2024) Convention committee chairs are selected.

18 months before the convention (January 2024) Submit a script for the skit inviting attendees to the next convention to the board of directors for approval. Receive, review, and rank logo suggestions provided by Board of Directors.

14 months before the convention (April 2025) Plan a display to set up at the current convention to interest people in attending next year's convention and discuss logistical needs with the convention planner. Prepare an invitation to be presented at the current convention. The convention co-chairs should make the presentation or assign people to do it.

12 months before the convention (June 2025) Submit to the president and president-elect the publicity items (bulletin insert and poster) to be sent to all circuit presidents before the fall rallies. Convention co-chairs and committee chairs begin meeting on a regular basis.

August 1, 2025 Send to the president, president-elect, and convention planner: Names, addresses, and phone numbers of committee chairs. At least two quotes on arrangements and costs for the rental of an organ. The board of directors will make the final decision and sign the written contract. Maps of the area with complete directions to the convention facility. Information about the area where the convention will be held. Send to CO approved bulletin insert and poster for posting.

October/November 2025 The convention co-chairs, convention committee chairs, and committee members will meet with the board of directors and the convention planner for a tour of the convention facilities and review each part of the convention. Submit any needed materials to the board for the convention newsletter.
