

### **IDENTITY REVEALED**

During Epiphany, you will come to understand that when the true identity of Jesus is revealed, you realize your own true identity as well.

### **JESUS IS THE LIGHT**

The prophet Isaiah vividly described humanity as "people walking in darkness." Then he foretold that a light would shine on them. Enveloped by sin, suffering, and death, we find our minds and hearts clouded. But Jesus is revealed as the promised light. He shines his light by preaching repentance and the good news of the kingdom. Our Savior is the Light of the world, and we reflect his light onto everyone around us.

## SCRIPTURE READINGS

### FIRST READING: Isaiah 8:19-9:4

*The prophet foretold that people walking in darkness would see a great light.*

<sup>19</sup>When someone tells you to consult mediums and spiritists, who whisper and mutter, should not a people inquire of their God? Why consult the dead on behalf of the living? <sup>20</sup>Consult God's instruction and the testimony of warning. If anyone does not speak according to this word, they have no light of dawn. <sup>21</sup>Distressed and hungry, they will roam through the land; when they are famished, they will become enraged and, looking upward, will curse their king and their God. <sup>22</sup>Then they will look toward the earth and see only distress and darkness and fearful gloom, and they will be thrust into utter darkness. <sup>1</sup>Nevertheless, there will be no more gloom for those who were in distress. In the past he humbled the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, but in the future he will honor Galilee of the nations, by the Way of the Sea, beyond the Jordan—<sup>2</sup>The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned. <sup>3</sup>You have enlarged the nation and increased their joy; they rejoice before you as people rejoice at the harvest, as warriors rejoice when dividing the plunder. <sup>4</sup>For as in the day of Midian's defeat, you have shattered the yoke that burdens them, the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor.

### SECOND READING: 1 John 2:3-11

*God's children walk in the light of Christ by living in love for God and for one another.*

<sup>3</sup>We know that we have come to know him if we keep his commands. <sup>4</sup>Whoever says, "I know him," but does not do what he commands is a liar, and the truth is not in that person. <sup>5</sup>But if anyone obeys his word, love for God is truly made complete in them. This is how we know we are in him: <sup>6</sup>Whoever claims to live in him must live as Jesus did. <sup>7</sup>Dear friends, I am not writing you a new command but an old one, which you have had since the beginning. *Jesus preached the light of the gospel to a world in the darkness of unbelief.*

<sup>12</sup>When Jesus heard that John had been put in prison, he withdrew to Galilee. <sup>13</sup>Leaving Nazareth, he went and lived in Capernaum, which was by the lake in the area of Zebulun and Naphtali— <sup>14</sup>to fulfill what was said through the prophet Isaiah: <sup>15</sup>“Land of Zebulun and land of Naphtali, the Way of the Sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles— <sup>16</sup>the people living in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned.” <sup>17</sup>From that time on Jesus began to preach, “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.” <sup>18</sup>As Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. <sup>19</sup>“Come, follow me,” Jesus said, “and I will send you out to fish for people.” <sup>20</sup>At once they left their nets and followed him. <sup>21</sup>Going on from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John. They were in a boat with their father Zebedee, preparing their nets. Jesus called them, <sup>22</sup>and immediately they left the boat and their father and followed him. <sup>23</sup>Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and healing every disease and sickness among the people.

Points of Interest (July-December) - Checkbook balance has gone from \$60,542 on July 1 to \$79,716 end of December, while at the same time funding some large expenditures from dedicated accounts - o \$2,924 for re-roofed garages (Church General account), \$7,382 classroom cooler/heater units (School General account), o \$6,805 Little Lambs tuition assistance (Tuition Assistance account) ... Member offerings of \$130,914 were about 13% under \$150,000 budgeted. Total income of \$211,844 was about 6% under \$224,434 budgeted. St. John's Princeton continues to support Little Lambs Learning Center, donating \$2250/month (\$27,000 FY commitment). Emmanuel has been paying 25% of our monthly commitment (\$11,752) to CALA for over a year. Continued financial support from Emmanuel in 2026 is uncertain... Expenses of \$179,616 were about 10% under \$200,619 budgeted. Net income of \$32,228 was ahead of \$23,815 budgeted. We appreciate and thank our brothers and sisters at Emmanuel and St. John's Princeton for their financial support in educating our youth.

For 20+ years many faithful volunteers served as shepherds for small groups of our church membership. The original intent of the program was to assist the elders and pastor in keeping contact with members of the congregation, making contacts, offering encouragement, and keeping a helpful eye on the sheep. However, times change, and ministry needs change. The program was no longer meeting its original goals. It became harder to find volunteers to serve. It is time to step back and perhaps retool the program in the future. A huge thanks to all those who served as shepherds in the past and those currently serving.
